- Four new firefighters are going through pre-employment processes, and will begin orientation in early May
- We are projecting apparatus build lead times. We likely will soon be looking for approval from the board to purchase a replacement for Truck 74. this unit is scheduled for replacement in 2029.

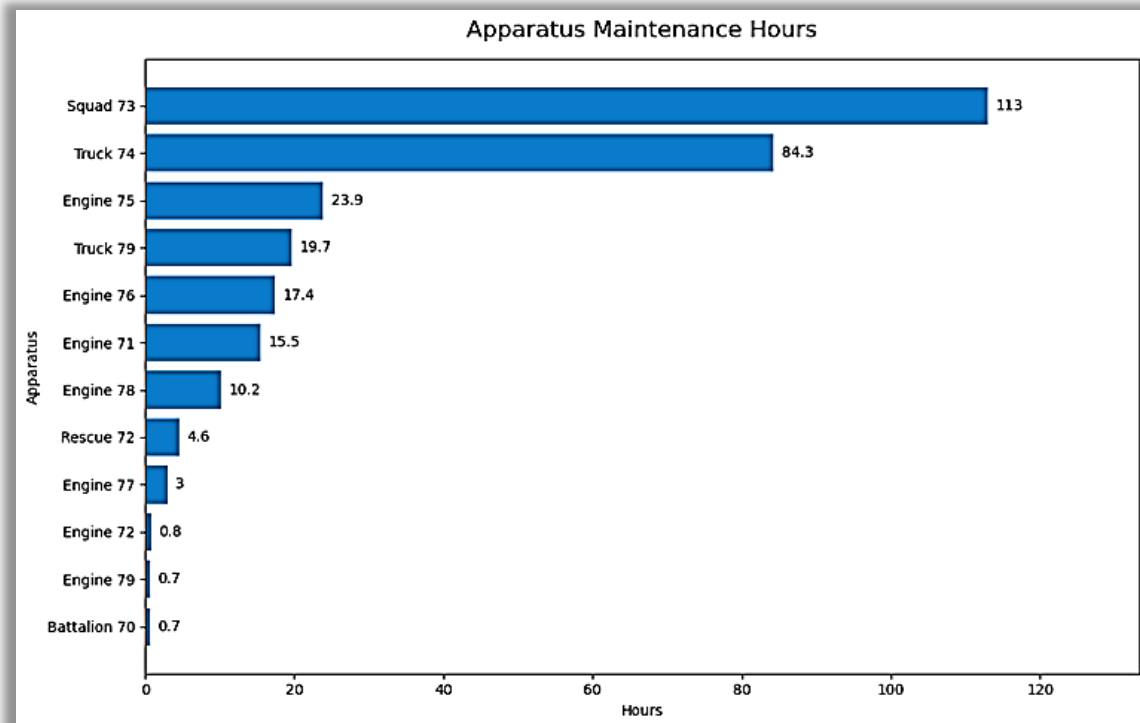
Operations:

- Newly promoted Lieutenants have started their Company Officer assignments
- Engineer promotional testing was announced on April 3rd, and we anticipate many candidates
- Over 2500 hydrants have been serviced throughout the District in support of dependable water supply for fire operations

Logistics:

Fleet Maintenance

- Fleet maintenance is on schedule with the fleet receiving over 293 hours of service in March.
 - E77 was equipped with the Captium system from IDEX.
 - This system will allow real time analysis of the health of the apparatus engine and pump.
 - Iona 4 and Iona 9 lighting and radio upfit is underway.



Technology Upgrades

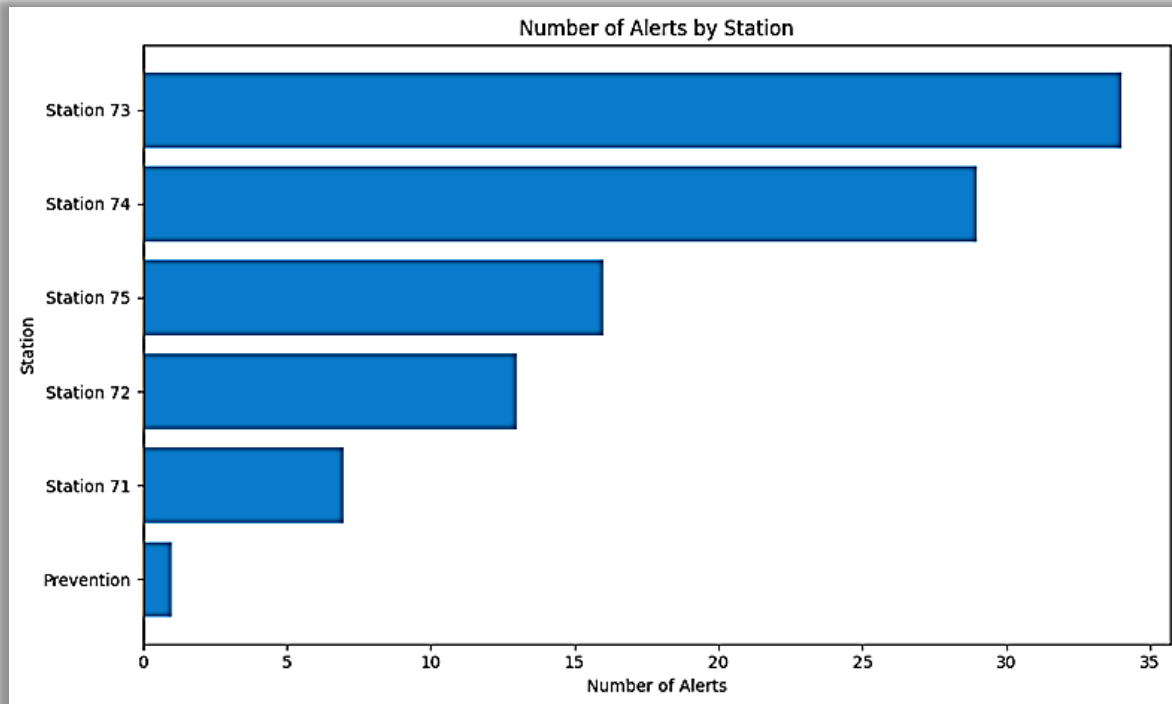
- The district has worked with CRS, our IT provider, to increase the security of the network using updated software to detect malicious attempts on the network through email and other means.

- On March 2nd, CRS Contreras participated in Read Across America at Temple Judea, reading *The Day I Had a Fire Truck* to students.
- On March 3rd, CRS Contreras conducted fire extinguisher training for staff at United Way, reinforcing workplace fire safety practices.

- On March 7th, IMFD hosted its Community Togetherness Open House, welcoming 40+ exhibitors and approximately 300 attendees, and distributed carbon monoxide detectors provided by the State Fire Marshal's Office.
- On March 8th, Truck 74 crew attended the Twin Palms community annual picnic, engaging with more than 100 residents and distributing fire safety materials.
- On March 12th and 31st, IMFD hosted CPR classes for Holiday Condo and Mastique Condo communities, training a total of 29 participants in lifesaving skills.
- On March 19th, Squad 73 crew participated in Water Day at Wa-Ke Hatchee during Spring Break, promoting safety through community interaction.
- On March 25th, CRS Contreras and Deputy Fire Marshal Marrero observed a surprise fire drill at Canterbury School to evaluate evacuation procedures.
- On March 31st, CRS Contreras launched the District's new Residential Fire Safety Program at Holiday Condo. Developed over the past year, the program is designed to help homeowners reduce fire risks and improve overall safety by providing practical education on fire prevention and emergency preparedness.

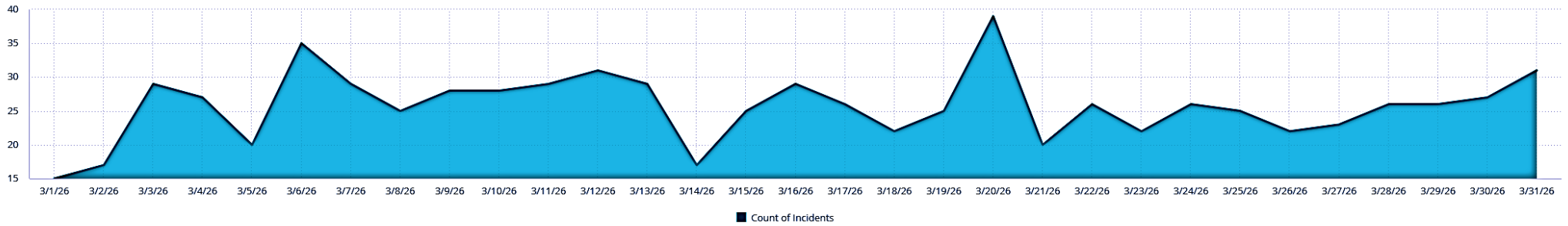
Fire Training/Special Operations:

- The division has been actively preparing for our new probationary firefighter class to begin their orientation next month. Capt. Hinton has been spearheading the process and has brought fresh ideas that will improve our process.
- Dive training this month focuses on members going through their annual scuba skills evaluations. These skills, performed annually, allow members to display their competency if faced with a variety of sub-surface emergency situations.
- Congratulations to FF Kevin Morris for completing his Boat Pilot sign off process. Under the guidance of Capt. Hagewood, FF Morris has been training for the past several months to complete this process.

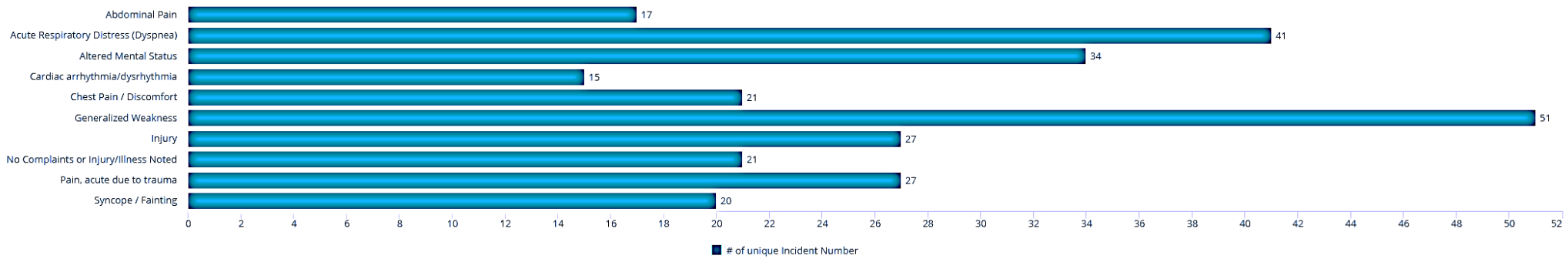
EMS, Health and Safety:

- Crews participated in OB training in March, learning techniques for normal and complicated delivery as well as management of peripartum hypertension. Training was provided by Nicole Schuman from Labor & Delivery at Health Park.
- Upon successful completion of paramedic school and passing of the National Registry exam and State certification, three new paramedics have entered into the credentialing process and have been placed with EMS Coordinators to facilitate their training. Credentialing builds on skills learned in school and ensures their capacity to meet the standards of the District's EMS program.
- Peer Support Team members participate in Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) facilitated by 2nd Alarm Project and Florida A&M University. This 2-day training utilizes evidence-based practices to build skills and engage in interactive learning to build confidence in helping someone who is expressing suicidal thoughts and behaviors.

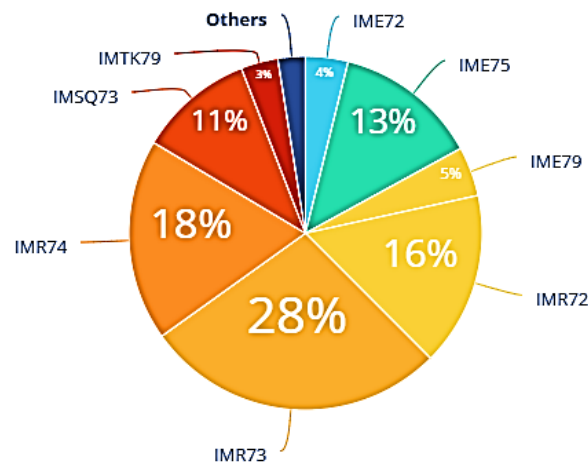
Call Volume by Day



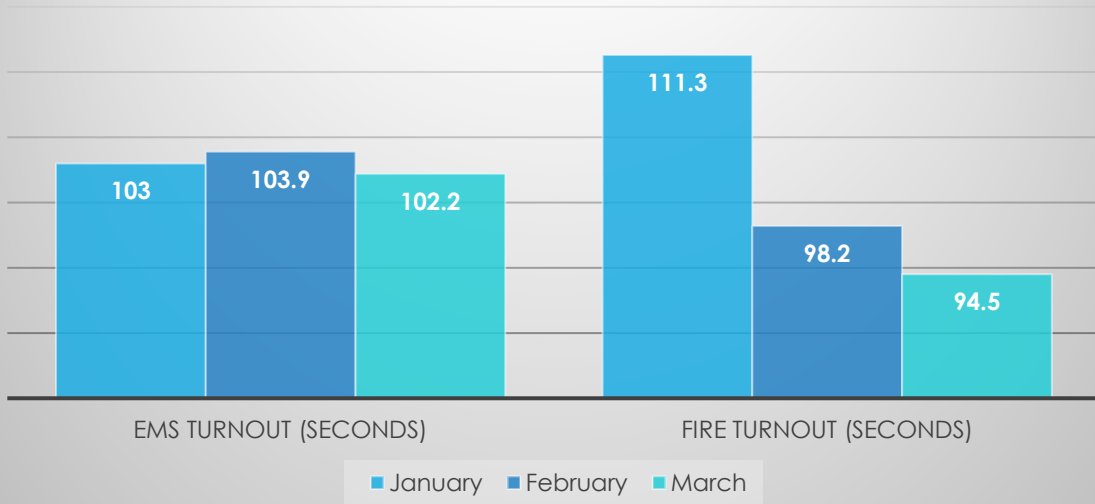
Top 10 Primary Impressions



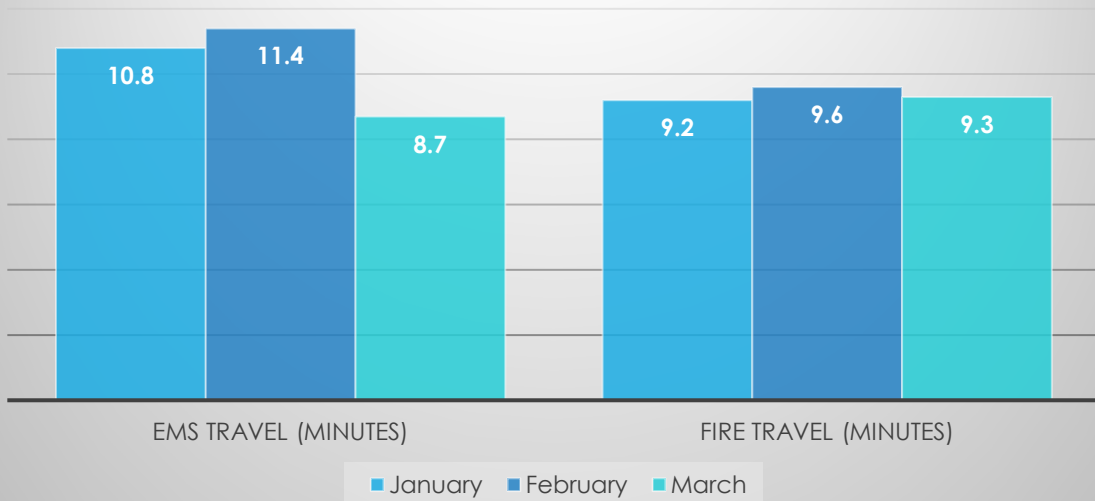
EMS Call Volume % by Unit



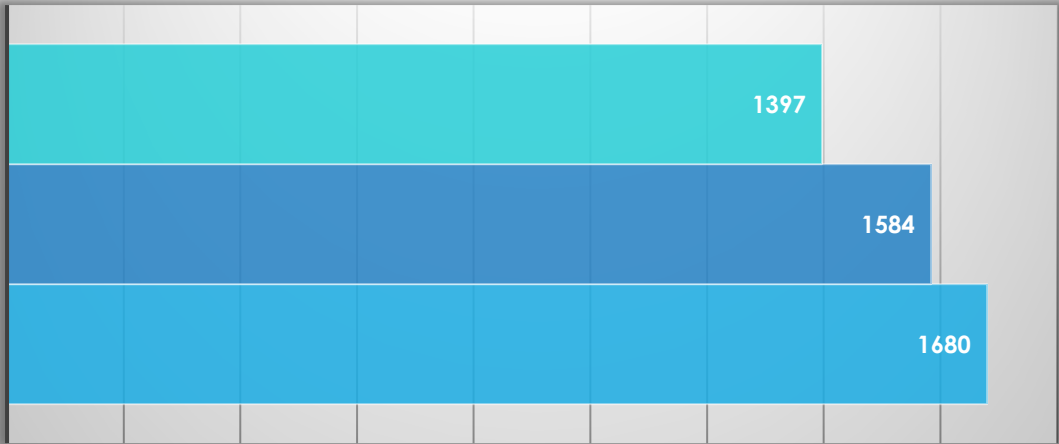
EMS & Fire Turnout Times (90th Percentile)
