



## Fire Chief:

- We are looking ahead at our capital replacement schedule. Truck 74 will be due for replacement in 2029. The lead time for build is approximately 3 years. We anticipate bringing an agenda item next month for the board to approve the purchase of a new Truck. This will lock us in on today's price. We won't pay until we take possession in 2029.

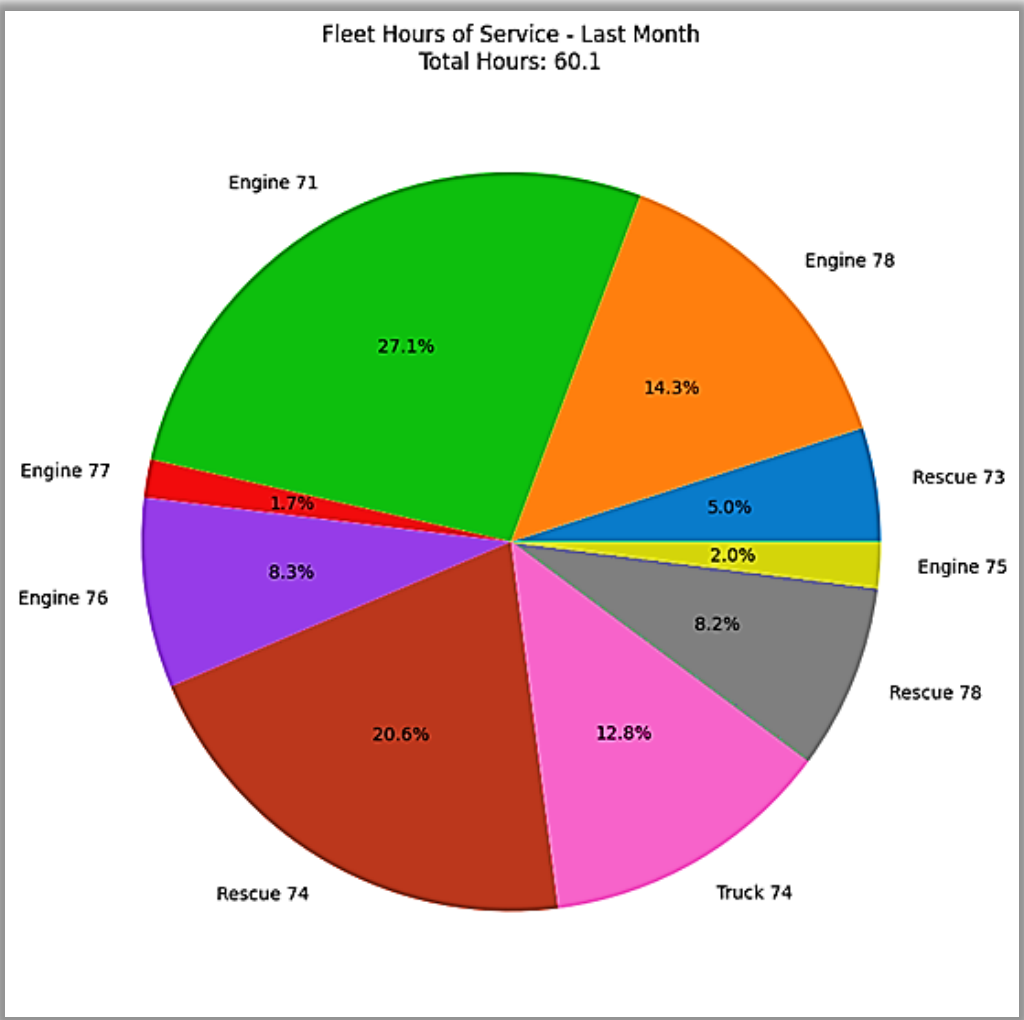
## Operations:

- Call volume had an unusual spike, but we anticipate a return to downward trend in May.
- Three (3) new firefighters (class 2601) have started their orientation journey which will conclude mid-June.
- Engineer promotional testing will include fifteen (15) candidates for the June 2026 process.
- Final inspection for a new rescue truck occurred in NY with final touches and delivery forthcoming.
- Hurricane season preparation and review occurs annually during May.

## Logistics:

### **Fleet Maintenance**

- Fleet Maintenance is on schedule with the fleet receiving over 60 hours of service in April.
- Iona 4 and Iona 9 were placed into service.
  - The district now has three staff vehicles in reserve for use when general service or annual maintenance are needed within the fleet.

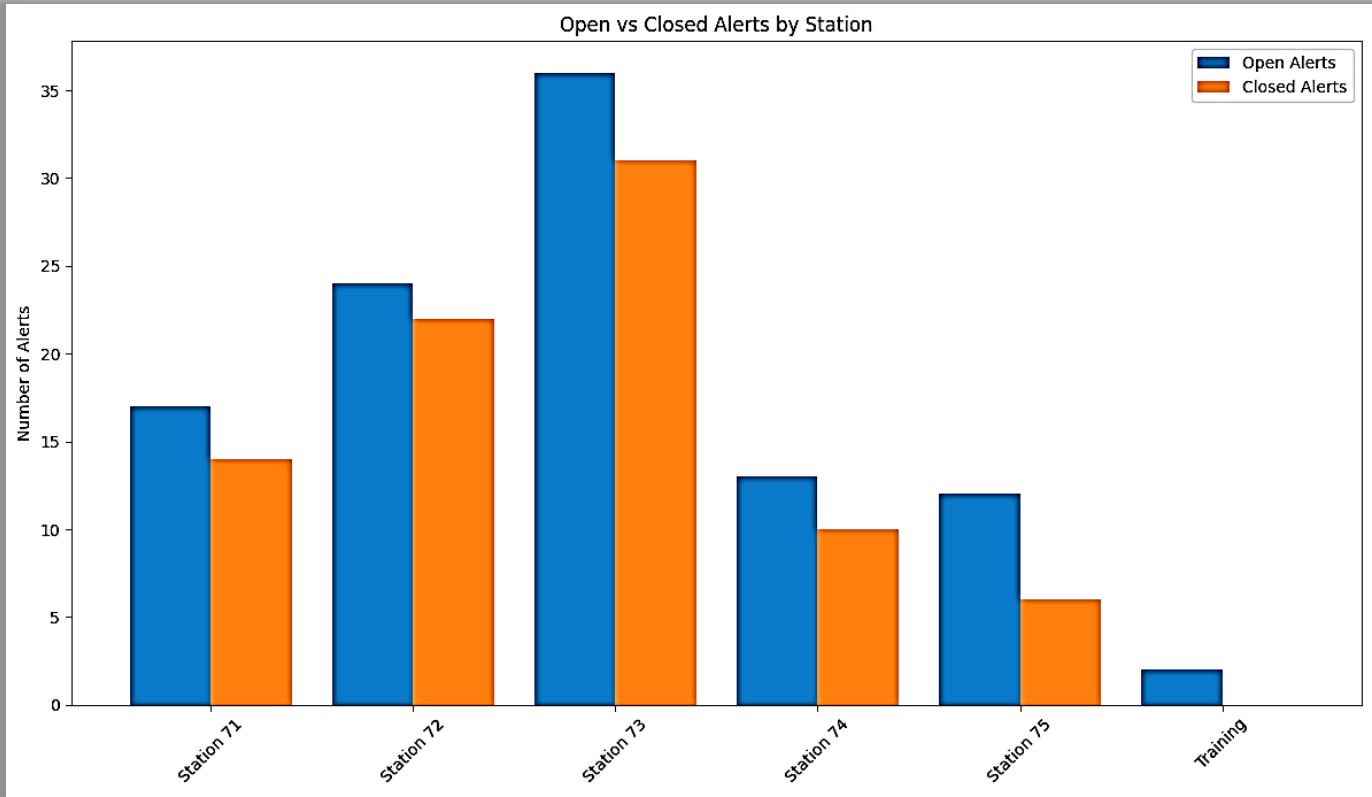


**Technology Upgrades**

- On April 1st, Inspector Eric Center completed probation, reflecting a successful first year serving the District and the Prevention Bureau.
- On April 2nd, FM Mozes, DFM Marrero, Division Chief Wisdom, and CRS Megan Contreras attended the grand opening of Fort Myers Beach Fire Station 31, rebuilt after the original station was destroyed by Hurricane Ian in 2022. The original station stood on land donated by Don and Ora Zimmer in 1951, which has since been returned to the Zimmer family, while the new station is constructed on the former Topps Supermarket property.
- On April 9th, Inspector Center, Lt. Quilty, and CRS Contreras delivered a presentation on fire and life safety at an HOA meeting for residents of Lexington Country Club.
- On April 14th, CRS Contreras and members of the bureau served as guest speakers at the monthly HOA meeting for Kelly Greens, discussing fire and life safety topics with residents.

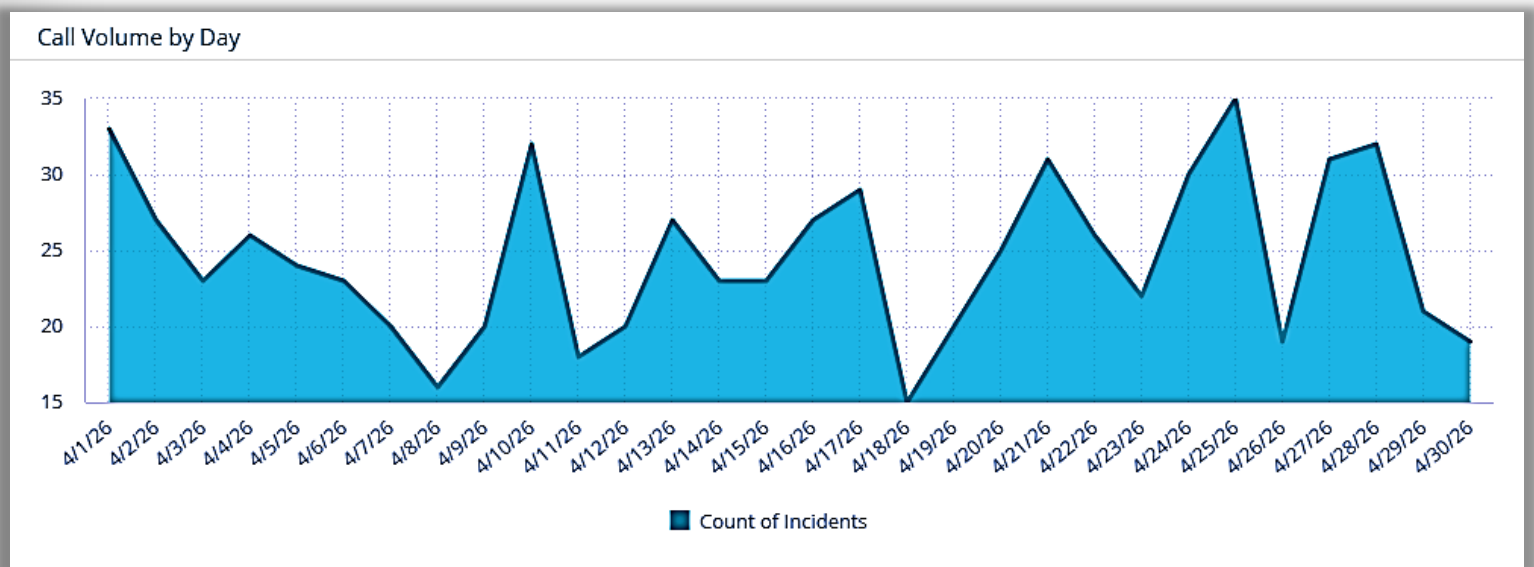
- Also on April 14th, CRS Contreras and members of the bureau presented the District's Residential Fire Safety Program to residents at Heritage Cove, sharing practical information on fire prevention and home safety. The presentation was coordinated by Commissioner Steve Allen, who resides within the community.
- On April 29th, the District provided CPR training to 28 participants from Thunderbird Mobile Home Park, Peace Lutheran Church, the Area Agency on Aging, and a local gym, helping strengthen community emergency preparedness. Following the training, the gym generously donated \$75 to the Iona McGregor Firefighters Association (IMFA).

## Fire Training/Special Operations:

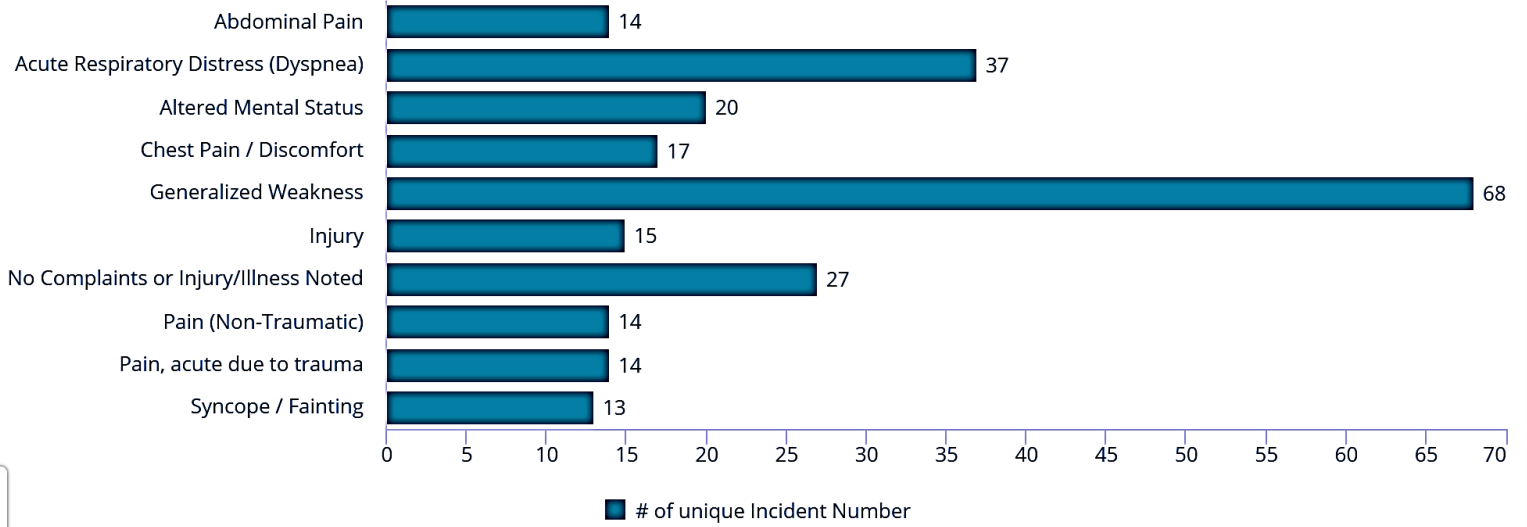
- Squad 73 participated in quarterly training at Alligator Towing with other Squad companies from around the county. Their training focused on vehicle extrication scenarios.
- Dive training conducted this month focused on rapid diver drills. This training involves the entire company, not just the diver, and drills companies on shore based and water-based skills.
- Several members of the organization participated in the 2026 State of Florida US&R Mobilization Exercise (MobEx). This annual drill from around the state brings all 8 US&R teams, TRT teams, MARC units, and an overhead team to drill on a disaster scenario. BC Jason Martin and Eng. Dionne Streete both had the opportunity to participate in roles for the State Incident Support Team. BC Martin filled the role of Division Supervisor and Eng. Streete filled the role of Logistics Section Chief.
- Probationary Firefighters from class 2501 completed their Module 2 written and practical test. All members were successful with their testing and continue to show improvement.

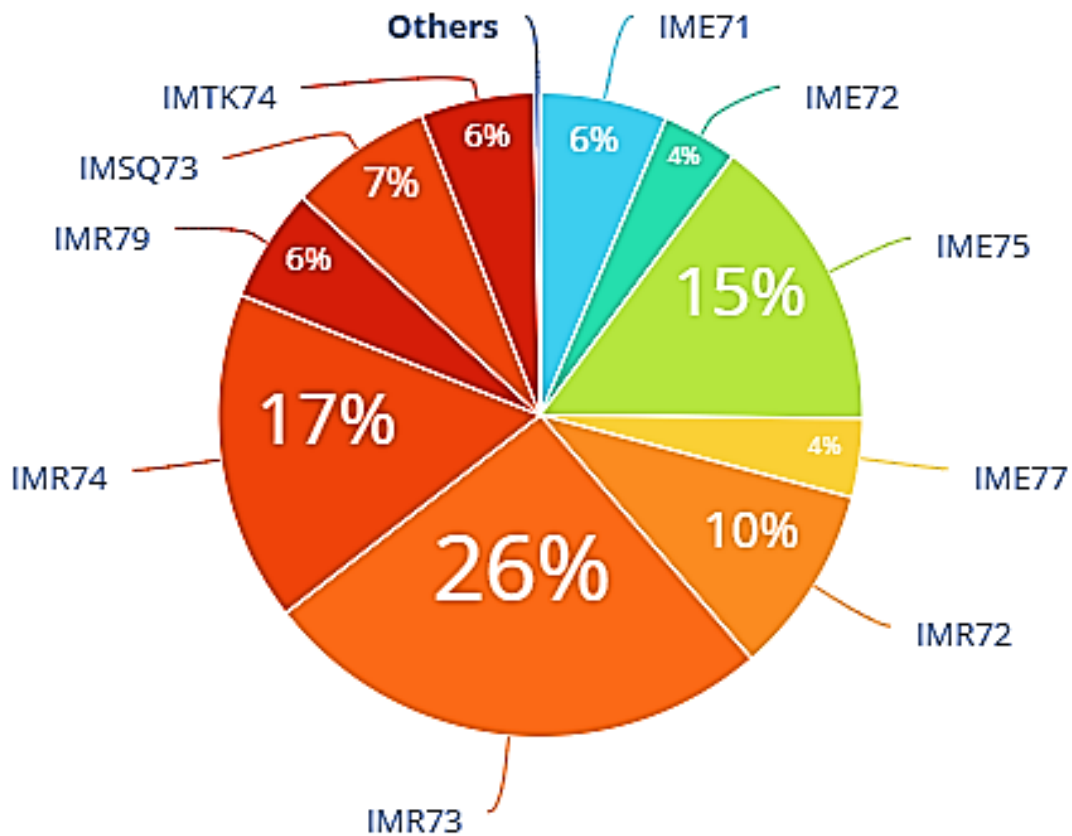

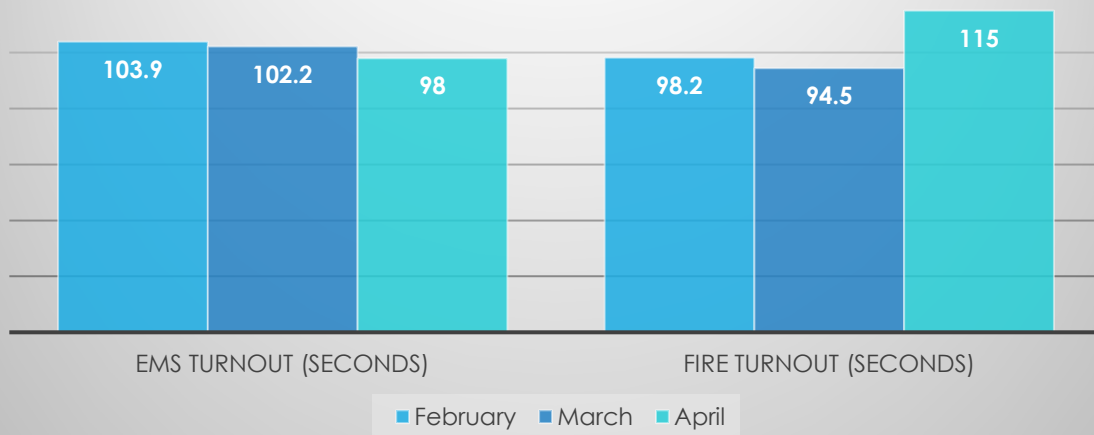
### Top 10 Primary Impressions



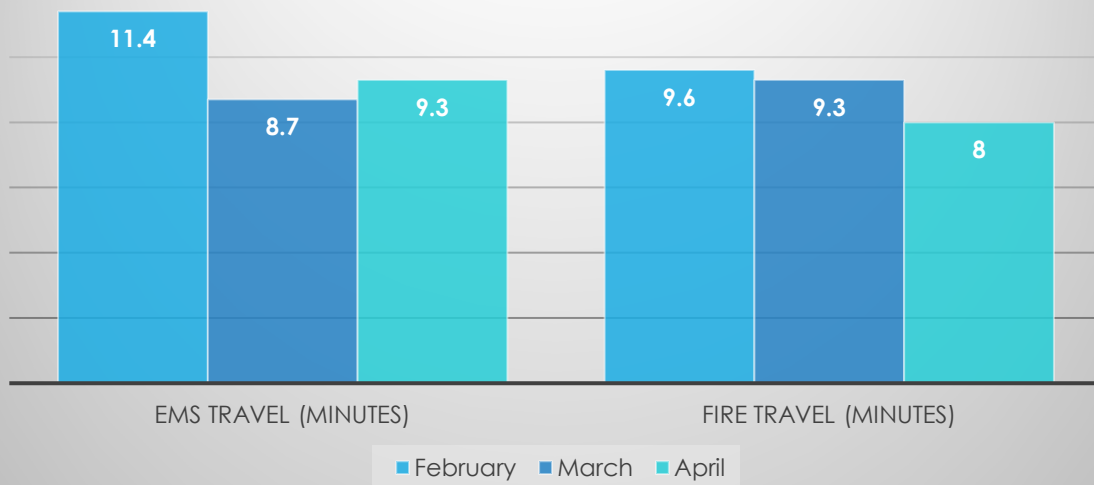
### EMS Call Volume % by Unit
