THEY DO NOT CONSTITUTE A VERBATIM RECORD OF THE ACTUAL COMPLETE STATEMENTS MADE DURING THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MEETING. ANYONE WHO IS INTERESTED IN A VERBATIM AUDIO RECORDING OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MEETING CAN REQUEST AN AUDIO RECORDING FROM THE RECORDS CUSTODIAN OF THE DISTRICT.

Meeting call to order at 6:07pm followed by Roll Call – Commissioners Walker, Kuhn, Dorsett, Barbosa, and Taylor present

Opening Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance was observed

Amendments to the Meeting Agenda

With no proposed changes, **motion** (5523) by Commissioner Kuhn with second by Commissioner Dorsett to adopt agenda... motion carries.

Presentations/Awards – DC Aquil briefly described a medical response at Beachwalk Isles; BC Mascarelli, Lt Hagewood, Eng Schwandner, FF West, FF McDonough, FF Blandon, and FF Keegan all received recognition pins for life save; Eng Drews was not present at meeting and will receive his pin at a later date. Commissioner Walker requested names of the award recipients stating that he will be buying dinner for all that received award this evening in form of gift card.

Public Input on Business Agenda Items – none

Business Agenda Items (Agenda Items Requiring Action)

1) Meeting Minutes – March 21, 2018 regular & April 9, 2018 workshop (Approval) **Motion** (5524) to approve minutes of March 21^{st} and April 9th, 2018 made by Commissioner Barbosa, second Commissioner Dorsett... Kuhn stated for the record that he was absent for the workshop due to unforeseen emergency hearing, after which the motion carried.

2) Financial Report – March, 2018 (Approval)

Commissioner Walker sought clarification on several financial items including the % of taxes received and the % of total expenditures. CFO Winzenread informed that the taxes received as well as the reported 49% of expenditures were in line as we are halfway through the fiscal year. Commissioner Walker then inquired as to increase in impact fees which are up this year due to development. CFO Winzenread explained what expenditures impact fees can and are used for. Commissioner Kuhn then questioned the Prevention Division report contained in the March minutes listing 28 violations in inspections that were not cleared. Chief responded that the report contains the information as of a set time and inspections that have cleared may not be entered, and followed with summary of the inspection and fee process including the possible citation process. With increase in impact are we trying to get away from debt, questioned Commissioner Kuhn, to which Chief affirmed. Attorney

Pringle was questioned as to whether another governmental agency could take any of the District's reserves if they were deemed in excess, as he had heard of this possibility. Attorney assured there is no basis for any government agency to take any of our reserves. Following discussion, **motion** (5525) to approve March, 2018 Treasurers Report made by Commissioner Dorsett, second Commissioner Barbosa... carried.

3) Advanced Life Support Provider renewal

Commissioner Walker questioned why this item came before the Board and why the County charges. The renewal process was described which requires Chair to enter into agreement for the renewal. As for the charge, Mr. Pringle informed the renewal agreement states that the County gives the District the right to perform ALS services and charges a fee for the license. Following explanation, **motion** (5526) to approve renewal of Advanced Life Support Provider (COPCN) and authorize chair to execute necessary documents made by Commissioner Dorsett, second Commissioner Barbosa... carried.

4) Revised Job Description – Fire Chief

Chief presented an amended page 4 denoting a proposed change from the term 'enrolled' to a phrase of 'or applied for and qualified as verified by NFA letter'. Commissioner Kuhn questioned CDM within 3 years, why not put timeline for the NFA as well. Chief addressed the concern by stating we give flexibility in knowing applicant may not be accepted first time around but still actively pursuing. How many people in Lee County are in EFO Quite common achievement, stated Chief, approximately 10 enrolled with program? another 5 or so already holding the certification. Battalion Chiefs are not excluded from application; Lieutenant is minimum stated DC Aquil, and admissions department focuses on what your role is in department. Why not require Fire Officer IV, questioned Commissioner Kuhn. Want to be 100% consistent; would like to see paramedic as requirement as well. Job Description review process included external and internal persons that came to consensus on requirements. EFO program assists in managing the district in business. Chief does not run calls and do not see need for paramedic requirement; between two, would take EFO, informed Chief. Functional key for Chief and other chief officers is to oversee business, not responding which would utilize requirement. Why require special district experience, questioned Commissioner Kuhn. Chief described difference in departments as autonomy with different environment, politics, operations, and budget. IAFC has chief officer development program and we have tried to mirror their recommendations and have external validation. Commissioner Kuhn stated he has several concerns; EFO requirement is too soon, too demanding, and should not have paramedic has preferred. He added that he will not vote for unless all a requirement or make EFO preferred and take away special district requirement. Commissioners Taylor and Dorsett explained that the qualified letter from NFA is ticket to apply for chief position – not bound by time. Preferred for special district would be the wishes of floor stated DVP Tansey. Commissioner Kuhn mentioned he wants to remove special District, would like to review NFA EFO requirements and letter, and paramedic piece; think chief should be paramedic.

Motion (5527) to table Chief Job Description for another month to allow peer review group to consider the concerns of board including Commissioner Kuhn's desire that the 'Special District' experience is unnecessary, that Paramedic be a requirement, and that the NFA CFO

program be preferred, unless he is satisfied with the applicant qualified acceptance letter provided by NFA; and bring back draft to board at next meeting made by Commissioner Barbosa, second Commissioner Kuhn... carries.

5) Revised Job Description – Assistant Chief

Commissioner Kuhn has concerns with EFO or actively pursuing, suggest preferred; and believes should be preferred as Fire Officer IV and paramedic required, adding that he would like to read EFO program to see what eligible for means at this level. **Motion** (5528) to table Assistant Chief Job Description for peer review to address concerns and bring to next meeting made by Commissioner Kuhn, second Commissioner Barbosa... carried.

6) Commission Election

Attorney Pringle stated that requirement is that board takes official action to call for election so the supervisor of elections will place on the ballot. He then read title into the record, **"Resolution 2018-01, A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE IONA MCGREGOR FIRE PROTECTION AND RESCUE SERVICE DISTRICT, LEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, ORDERING AND CALLING AN ELECTION OF MEMBERS FOR THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO BE HELD IN THE GENERAL ELECTION ON NOVEMBER 6, 2018."** Adding that the resolution calls for the election of seats 1, 3 & 5 which serve for a length of time of 4 years; and states candidate qualification including the period of qualifying as a candidate for a Commissioner of Iona McGregor Fire Protection and Rescue Service District shall be from Noon on June 18, 2018, through Noon on June 22, 2018. Candidates shall qualify with the Supervisor of Elections of Lee County, Florida. **Motion** (5529) to adopt Resolution 2018-01 as read into record by Attorney Pringle calling for election of commissioner Barbosa...

7) Chief's Report

Chief's Executive Report was included in the Commission packet as General Update:

Executive Staff performed a fiscal year second quarter Budget review on April 10. The divisional and general fund budgets are trending as expected, predominately under the fifty percent mark.

The placing of the straw poll question concerning fire service consolidation on the 2018 ballot is still not certain. The Lee County Legislative Delegation has responded to the BOCC's request for additional information concerning the straw poll ballot. The email from Representative Caldwell to members of the Lee County BOCC presents compelling support for the "fire service consolidation straw poll" being placed on the 2018 ballot. I would anticipate the BOCC addressing this item at an upcoming meeting.

Staff is currently working on the strategic plan 6-12-month update. Progress continues toward achieving our goals through completion of the identified objectives and critical task.

The trend across all organizational performance metrics are as expected with no major items to report.

Commissioner Walker questioned the Executive Report title rather than Chief's report. Chief responded that this is an administrative summary for the month, and along with the division reports summarizes what has been done. Chief then stated that the Lee County Board of Commission voted down the straw poll for the upcoming election to which Commissioner Walker asked why this information was not included in the report. Chief responded that he only learned of this on Tuesday as the vote took place on Tuesday around 10:30 a.m. Following discussion, **motion** (5530) to accept the Chief's report was made by Commissioner Walker and seconded by Commissioner Barbosa... carried.

8) Division/Committee Reports

Division Chief McMillion's Training report was included in the packet.

- Reporting software has been implemented and "live" since April 3rd. IMFD is now EMSTAR (Emergency Medical Service Tracking and Reporting) and NEMSIS (National Emergency Medical Service Information System) compliant with implementing this new software. Training is going to continue to train crews on the software intensely to ensure all responders have mastered the software.
- Training and Operation are continuing to conduct multi-company drills in real time scenarios.
- Training will be attending the Fire Department Instructor Conference (FDIC) this month in Indiana with intentions to gain knowledge of new technologies, training techniques, health and safety initiatives, progressive tactics and strategies in the fire service.
- IMFD has one paramedic starting the credentialing process, Firefighter Andrew Herron.
- Captain Crisman completed his Incident Safety Officer class.
- Staff Assistant Tracy Acuff has successful integrated the RFID medical inventory system to perform efficiently.

The number of incidents was requested, to which DC McMillion informed that for the period of April $3^{rd} - 17^{th}$ there were 512 incidents – 36% fire calls (three actual structure fires). A brief discussion of apparatus response including medical calls can be run by

engines or rescues took place. Chief Howard provided a copy of the report which was provided by DC McMillion and omitted from the packets in error.

DC Aquil's Operation division report was included in packet:

- Crews are continuing to adjust to new reporting/documentation software with more supplemental training this month. Progress is occurring at a desirable pace.
- March multi-company drills concluded and April multi-company drills in progress; and crews assisted with a Fort Myers Beach fire for the second time in <2 months.
- One Lieutenant has successfully completed 12 month probationary period since being promoted last year.
- Operations personnel are engaged and providing welcomed input.
- Positive representation of IMFD continues: C-shift crews involved in save of pediatric drowning.

After brief probation period and evaluation process discussion, **motion** (5531) to accept the division reports was made by Commissioner Walker with second by Commissioner Barbosa... carried.

Although DC Guzman and DC Steffens were not present for meeting, their respective division reports were also included in the packets:

- Attended the Pre Construction Meeting for new Engine 72 in Ohio
- Truck should be delivered early October
- New staff vehicles are arriving- Coordinating with Lightning Wireless to outfit vehicles with appropriate equipment.
- Working on remodeling Station 74's training room
- Electrical work has been completed at station 74 in preparation for the new air fill station.
- New thermal imaging cameras (TIC) have been ordered (TIC assist in finding victims in a fire. TIC also assist in locating the fire and monitoring temperatures during fire attack.
