Meeting called to order at 6:00 p.m.

Roll Call of Commissioners

Present – Commissioner Louwers, Commissioner Langford, Commissioner Andersen, Commissioner Barbosa via telephone, and Commission Chair Walker

Business Agenda Items (Agenda Items Requiring Action)

1) Meeting Minutes – April 15, 2020

Motion (5706) to adopt minutes of April 15, 2020 made by Commissioner Andersen, second Commissioner Langford... carried.

2) Financial Report – April 2020

Report provided previous and CFO Winzenread is available for questions. Following no questions, **motion** (5707) to approve April 2020 financial report made by Commissioner Langford with second offered by Commissioner Andersen... carried.

3) Audit Presentation

Jeff Tuscan with Tuscan & Company was introduced and gave brief presentation of the 2019 audit beginning with Opinion Letter. We have received highest level an auditor can issue. No material weaknesses, no non-compliance was noted. Cash and investment test identified that District is in compliance with regulations. Graph detail was presented and reviewed. The current depreciation threshold is \$1,000 and next year it is changing to \$5,000. Pension liability is our portion of FRS liability calculated by actuary study by State reducing the projected rate of return at 6.9%, and our workforce is younger which increases the liability. Net OPEB liability is projected future cost of providing insurance for retirees until they reach Medicare age. Following presentation, **motion** (5708) was made by Commissioner Langford to approve the audit as presented. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Louwers. Chair called for roll vote whereby Commissioners Langford, Louwers, Andersen, Barbosa, and Walker all in favor; passed unanimously.

4) Commission Election

Attorney Pringle described the election process to Board, including the necessity for the Board to formally adopt a resolution calling for the election for the termed seats. He then read the resolution in the record as, "Resolution 2020-01, A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE IONA MCGREGOR FIRE PROTECTION AND RESCUE SERVICE DISTRICT, LEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, ORDERING AND CALLING AN ELECTION OF MEMBERS FOR THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO BE HELD IN THE GENERAL ELECTION ON NOVEMBER

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3, 2020... Seat #2 and Seat #4..." Following attorney's reading of the resolution title, **motion** (5709) to adopt Resolution 2020-01 as read into the record was made by Commissioner Walker and seconded by Commissioner Andersen... The roll vote was as follows:

5) Surplus Item

It is requested that a fog smoke machine which is no longer used and has a value of less than \$250.00 be deemed surplus, and the chief authorized to dispose of the item in accordance with FS 274.06. **Motion** (5710) to deem item surplus and authorize Chief to properly dispose of was made by Commissioner Langford, seconded by Commissioner Andersen. Following call for roll vote, results were Commissioners Langford, Andersen, Louwers, Barbosa, and Walker all in favor. Motion carries.

6) Codification Resolution (For Discussion Only)

Attorney Pringle provided Board with a draft resolution and corresponding documents to be reviewed and brought back for discussion and possible action at the June 2020 meeting. He briefly described the items included in the resolution as well as the some of the exhibits attached. It was recommended that a workshop be conducted to fully review and explain the documents contained within. Commissioner Walker mentioned that he is not sure that all of this is necessary and relevant to us since goes back to 1980. Louwers stated that an hour-long workshop wouldn't be bad. Langford agrees to have workshop as does Andersen. No action taken. Workshop could be an hour before regular June meeting, and needs to be advertised. **Motion** (5711) to establish Workshop for June 10, 2020 beginning at 5p.m. was offered by Commissioner Walker, second Commissioner Andersen... carried.

7) Executive Report

Executive Report was included in the packet previously distributed. Commissioner Walker questioned the anticipated promotions. Chief informed of recent and upcoming retirement of personnel which will result in promotional needs. Commissioner Langford questioned what we are looking at natural gas for. Chief informed that generator at Station 73 has been converted and looking to convert the stove as well. My convert other stations to natural gas in the coming years. Following questions/discussion, **motion** (5712) to accept the Executive Report was made by Commissioner Louwers and seconded by Commissioner Langford... passed.

9) DVP Reports – Districts 7 & 25 District 7 – DVP Tansey has nothing to report

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District 25 - DVP Mascarelli mentioned that the boat dock is in need of pontoon replacement as has developed leak.
