The year began with a tornado that tore through several mobile home communities, parts of Gulf Harbour, and other communities in the Iona area, causing devastating damage.

In April, we said farewell to Fire Chief David Howard who retired after 37 years of service to the community. We know he is enjoying his well-deserved retirement. Of course, we will never forget Hurricane Ian which was one of, if not the most notable event to occur in Southwest Florida history. The district was impacted greatly by this event. We are grateful the district was able to sustain apparatus, equipment, and staff to continue to provide service to our community. We continue to be amazed by the resilience our community shows as efforts to recover continue.

While dealing with these significant events throughout the year, staff also worked at continuous quality improvement across all aspects of district operations. In preparation for accreditation in the future, staff conducted a self-assessment by measuring against 252 performance indicators of industry best-practices. This has provided a roadmap for continued quality improvement. The purpose of these efforts is to demonstrate to our community that we are proactively measuring ourselves against these industry standards and implementing plans to improve. We anticipate continuing to work through the process and achieving accreditation in calendar year 2023.

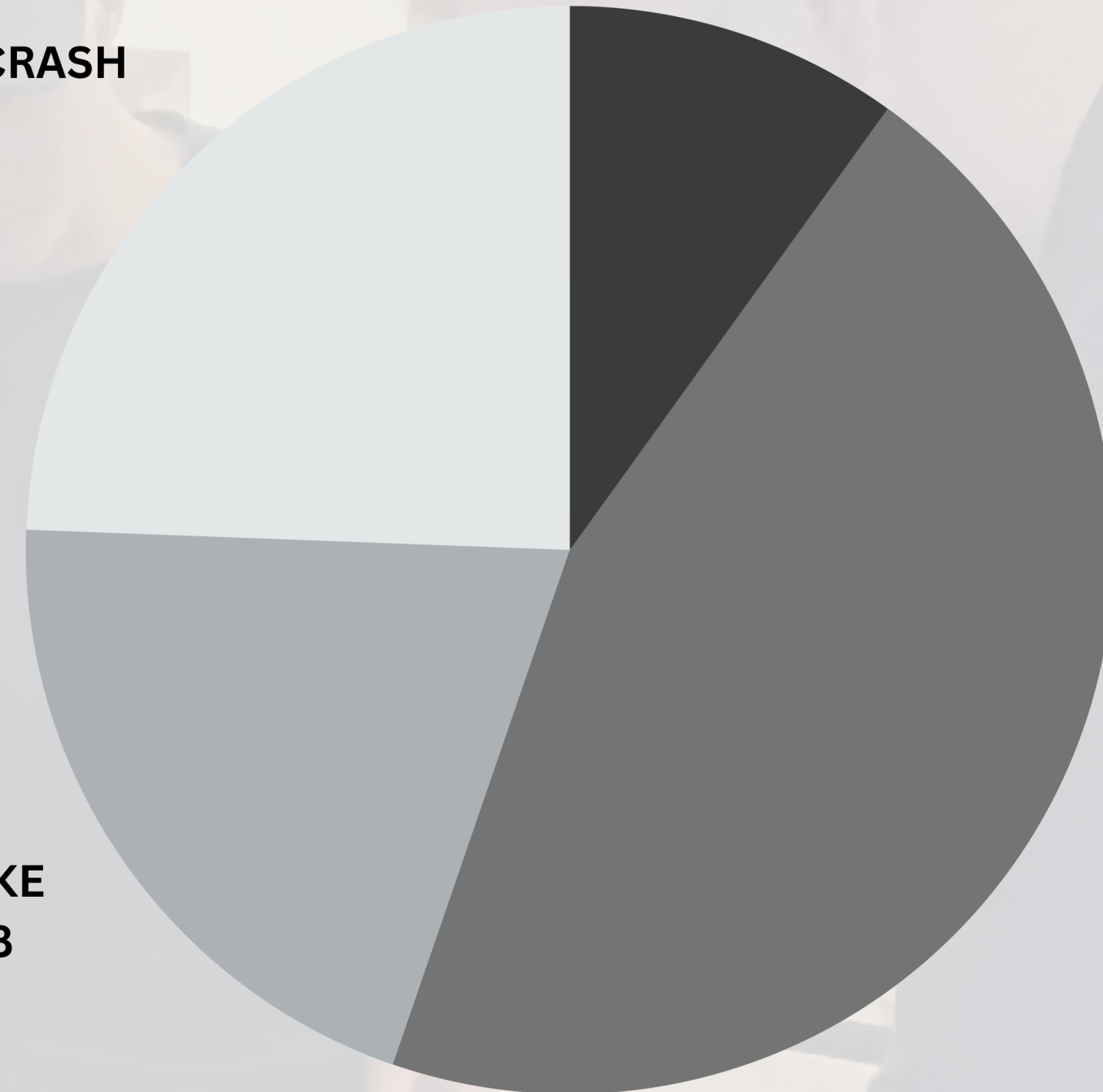

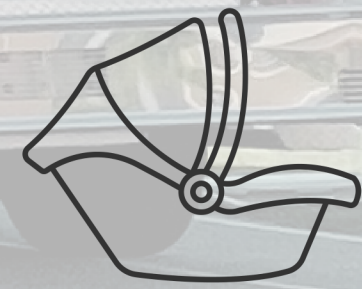

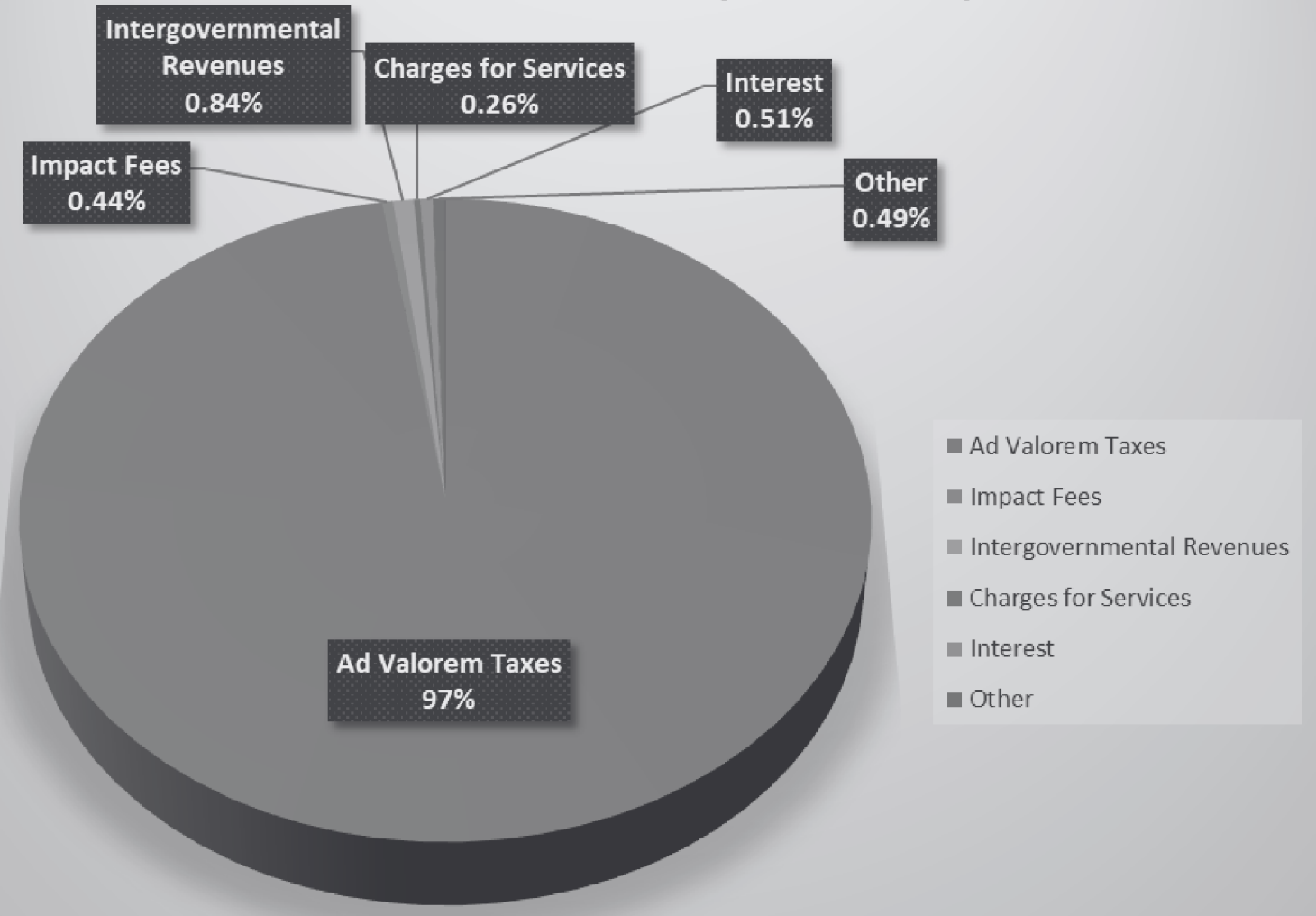

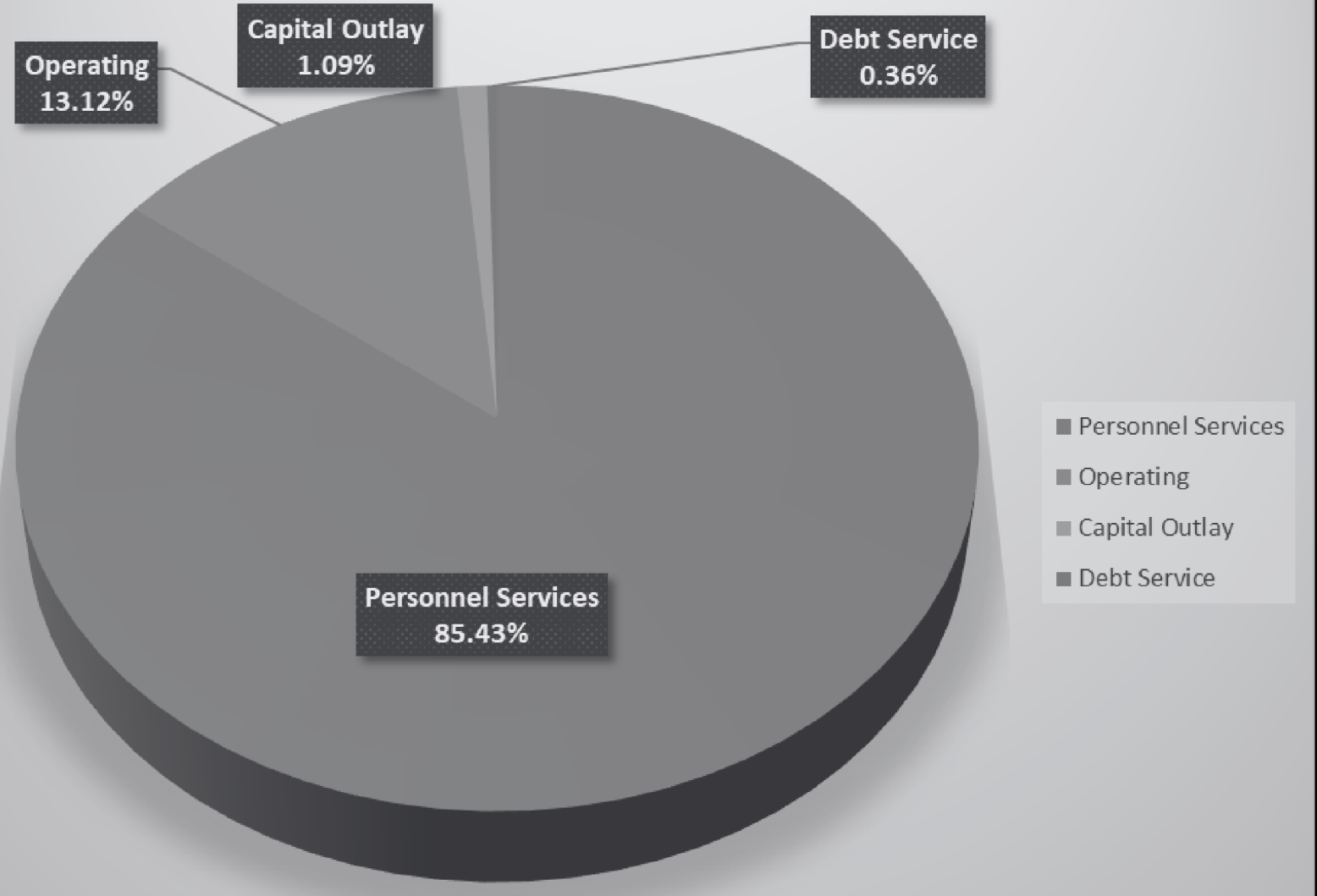
